



DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE MEMBERS

About the Disciplinary Committee

The purpose of the Disciplinary Committee is to rule on infractions of the Code of Conduct by members of Powerlifting America (except anti-doping rule violations), to oversee the disciplinary proceedings, and to impose penalties. The Committee also facilitates appeals to the Board when needed.

Key Responsibilities

- Participate in meeting and contribute analysis, investigate and research issues, provide thought leadership, and engage in collaborative decision making on matters requiring action by the committee.
- Attend at least half of all scheduled Disciplinary Committee meetings.
- Collaboratively draft policy and procedures to guide the work of the Disciplinary Committee, partnering with the Ethics Committee to ensure clear lines of responsibility.
- Work with PA staff and the Ethics and Law and Legislation Committees to design and implement a complaints intake process.
- Investigate and make rulings in response to individual disciplinary issues.

Anticipated Time Commitment

- Monthly meetings and additional ad hoc meetings as needed.
- Five hours per month for tasks particularly related to developing policy and procedures in the first year.

Basic Eligibility

- Powerlifting America member for at least two years as of the application date.
- 18 years old and hold a current U.S. passport.
- Are not members of another powerlifting federation.
- Complete a background check within 30 days of election.

Ethics Requirements

- Must not be a spouse, parent, child, or sibling of another Executive Committee member or Board member.
- Cannot receive compensation from Powerlifting America.
- No self-dealing – for example, must recuse oneself from matters in which the committee member may have a stake or relationship.

Term

Disciplinary Committee members shall serve a four-year term and may serve no more than three elected terms, with a maximum of twelve years.

Compensation

This is a volunteer role.

Selection and Application Process

The Disciplinary Committee members are appointed with selection done by the Disciplinary Chairperson and Board members.

Interested candidates should submit a resume and a letter of interest outlining their commitment to Powerlifting America's mission and demonstrating how their experience meets the required qualifications using the following JotForm:
